



Calgary-founded organization granted over \$300,000 to spearhead 2021 programming in support of women/womxn in the technology sector

May 10, 2021 – Now more than ever in Alberta we see the importance that our local tech sector plays in the evolution of our regional and national economy.

Chic Geek has been awarded over \$300,000 in in 2021 to implement NEW programming, which will accelerate the development of Alberta's growing tech sector while focusing on female leadership roles and career retention in the region's STEM industries.

This new funding helps us mark the birth of the <u>Career Pathing program</u>. Programming that will increase career visibility for intermediate womxn in technology so that they're better engaged and retained in their work. This is Chic Geek's solution to stop the leaky talent funnel when it comes to womxn in tech.

Career Pathing is built for individuals, organizations and industry. With the support of The Federal-Alberta Government, the private sector and individuals, programming will include initiatives that set up communities and connections between womxn in beginning and intermediate areas of technology with role-models to show possibilities, opportunities, and growth areas in their career.

2021 Alberta grants received by Chic Geek include: The Labour Market Partnership Federal-Provincial; Small Medium Enterprise Relaunch Grant; Civil Society Fund Grant and Coalition Support for Calgary Entrepreneurs in partnership with Alberta Innovates.

"Alberta's tech sector is vital to the success of our economy, and we hope the Civil Society Grant helps encourage more women into this field. It is no secret women are underrepresented in technology careers. This program will help more women enter the workforce and become leaders in the province's STEM industries."
